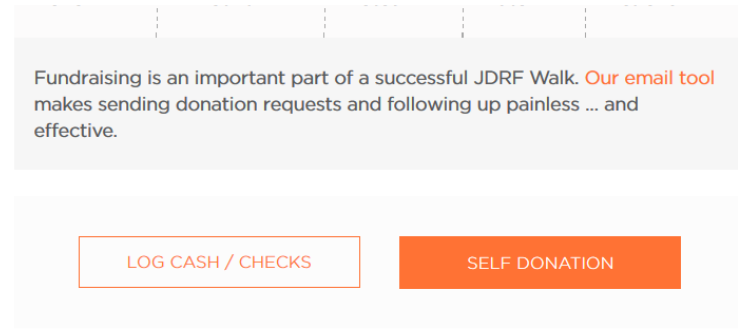
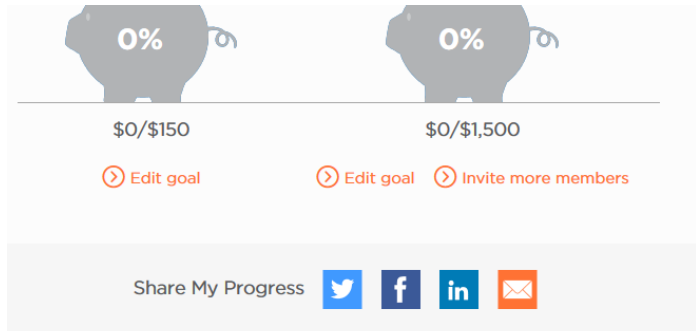

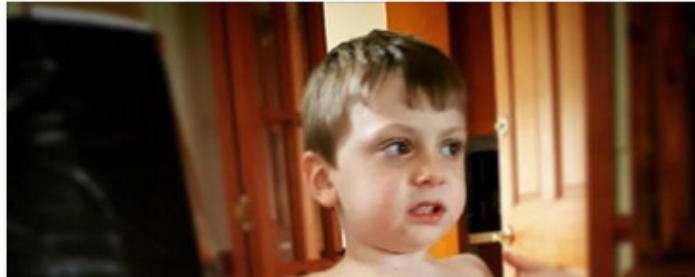

It is brand-spanking-new technology, a hybrid-closed-loop system (ask me if you want to know more about what this means), and we are both terrified and excited to know that our boy will have access to something like this. If it works as reported, it will make managing his type 1 diabetes - I dare not say "control," because there IS no controlling it - that much easier.

JDRF was instrumental in partnering with [Medtronic Diabetes](#) to bring this dream to fruition over the last decade. It is not a cure, not yet, but it is a HUGE step forward towards one.

This is the JDRF bag of hope. Newly diagnosed children receive this bag and contents free of charge when first diagnosed. Some of the contents are a glucometer, a carb counting guide, a comic book about a superhero with diabetes, literature for the family and school but most importantly Rufus the bear with diabetes and his book. This tells the story of a young boy being diagnosed and a bear he becomes friends with. The Rufus bear has patches where injecting insulin is done. This helped Daniel learn to handle his needles. When he switched to a pump, so did Rufus. Money raised helps not only fund research. It helps kids like Daniel feel a little better in a horrible time in their young lives.
